The Season

During the Pentecost Season we give our attention to the teachings of Christ... to the Son of God's words. We gather each week to let the Holy Spirit do the work Jesus promised he would do in the way Jesus promised he would do it—through his Word.

The Sunday

Those who hear and heed the Scriptures often appear to receive little benefit in life. Living by God's Word doesn't make life easier. Great wealth gains you the admiration and respect of the world. Grant us these things, Father, for the sake of Jesus, who died and rose again.



