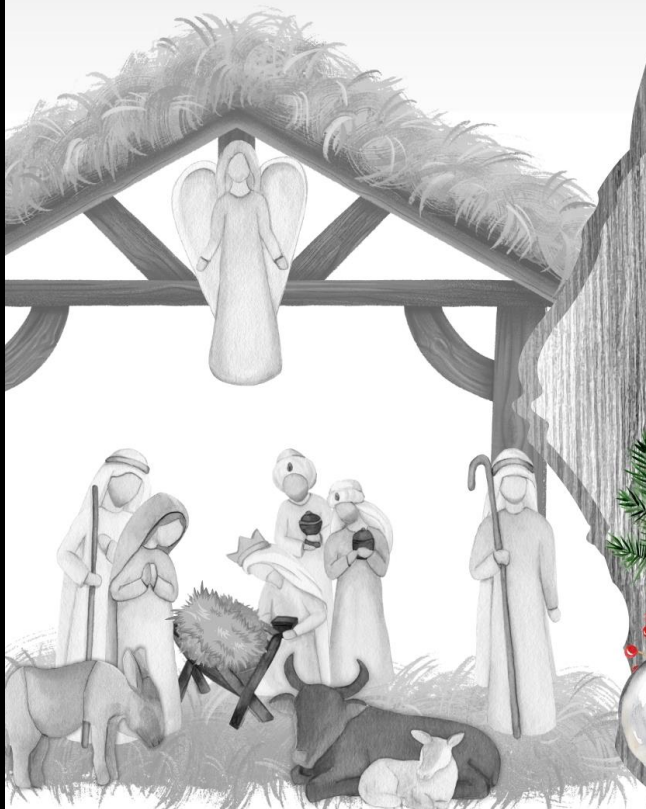

#### **The Season**


