FORWARD: PLANNING WHAT GOES ON INSIDE

Recap of the Church Building Progress

At the end of March we will be halfway through the Forward capital campaign. At this time almost 50% of pledges have come in. Pledges totaled \$315,924, of which \$157,332 has been given. Beyond that, over \$80,000 of unpledged offerings have been given, bringing the total given since March 1, 2023 to \$239,275. The Task Force has also been informed that a large bequest, which will be in the hundreds of thousands, will be donated to the building fund in the coming months. More information on that will be shared when the numbers are finalized. The Task Force is confident that, with the Lord's blessing, with the commitments to the capital campaign fulfilled by the end of March 2025, we will have a building fund total of \$2.8 million. This is over half of the anticipated cost of building. If unpledged funds continue to come in, as we pray they will, the total would be more. In addition to all this, an anonymous donor has pledged \$360,000 to be given in monthly increments when the payments for the mortgage begin. Other congregation members have informed the Task Force of generous bequests included in their wills and trusts. The Lord has blessed us through the generosity of his people.

The Task Force, on behalf of the congregation, is pursuing a loan of \$2.5 million from National Exchange Bank and Trust. The loan officer has requested more documentation to accompany our application, and that information is being secured. The Task Force, along with Groth Design and Catalyst Construction, are working on a plan that will give us a move in ready (including furnishings) church building for \$5.3 million.

At the soup supper served by the Task Force, a congregation member asked about the possibility of adding solar panels to the building. After discussing this idea with the architect, and considering the cost and whether energy savings would balance the cost, it was decided not to pursue this option. The Task Force is thankful for the suggestion, and any others brought to them by congregation members.

Future Plans for Ministry

As much of a blessing that the new building will be for our congregation, even more is a renewed ministry within those walls. This will include many opportunities for members to serve. Prayerfully consider how you might be able to serve in the following areas:

- Visitation Work Group: Inreach to the members of the congregation and outreach to the community. Contact Mike Baumann (information in right column of this page).
- Vacation Bible School: July 8-12 Help with Bible stories, snacks, games, crafts or music. Contact Pastor Henning.

- Lutheran Military Support Group: We could use a leader to facilitate this group that works not only with active military and their families, but also supports veterans in our congregation and community. Contact Pastor Henning


Dear St. Lucas Family,
