Lord, have mercy.


For the peace of the whole world, for the well-being of the Church of God, and for the unity of all, let us pray to the Lord.

1 Corinthians 1:18-25

We worship Christ for what he did on the cross.

¹⁸For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹For it is written:

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate."

²⁰Where is the wise person? Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the philosopher of this age? ¹⁸The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?"


¹⁹Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."


