

Out of love for the truth and from desire to elucidate it, the Reverend Father Martin Luther, Master of Arts and Sacred Theology, and ordinary lecturer therein at Wittenberg, intends to defend the following statements and to dispute on them in that place. On October 31st 1517, Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg Germany. Thus began the Protestant Reformation and the break from the Roman Catholic Church. This was of paramount importance in maintaining the truth of the Gospel, challenging the established practices of the Roman Catholic Church and making distinctions based on scripture as the sole authority.

One important practice of the Roman Catholic Church the 95 Theses addressed was the sale of indulgences, offering the remission of sins in exchange for monetary contributions to the church. Luther vehemently criticized this practice, arguing that it undermined the central message of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. His assertion that salvation was a matter of faith and not dependent on financial transactions reaffirmed the core teachings of the Gospel.

Additionally, Luther's 95 Theses emphasized scripture over tradition. He asserted that scripture was the ultimate authority in matters of faith and that all doctrines should be in alignment with the teachings found within. This shift in perspective had a profound impact on the interpretation of the Gospel and encouraged individuals to study the scriptures themselves, fostering a more direct connection with God's word.

Furthermore, the 95 Theses brought forth a movement that led to the translation of the Bible into various languages, making it accessible to a wider audience and promoting literacy. This enabled more people to engage with the Gospel directly and contributed to the democratization of religious knowledge.

Martin Luther's 95 Theses were vital in preserving the truth of the Gospel by challenging corrupt practices, emphasizing the authority of scripture, and paving the way for a more personal and accessible relationship with God's Word through scripture and biblical teachings..

Confession


If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God. ²⁰Therefore no one will be declared righteous in God's sight by the works of the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of our sin.

²¹But now apart from the law the righteousness of God has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. ²²This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. ²⁵God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of his blood—to be received by faith. 
Preface


